
## HALL OF FAME 2022





Our 2022 Inductee into the MSU Summer Scholars On Stage Hall of Fame is Leah Wright. Leah is currently a preschool teacher, and lives in Birmingham, Alabama, with her husband, Jonathan Wright, as well as her beloved dogs and cat. Leah first attended On Stage as a camper in 2004. For the next two years, she was selected by On Stage staff and fellow campers to serve as a Junior Counselor. Beginning in 2007, she served as a Girl's Counselor, a Lead Writer during Writer's Camp, and a Music Assistant during Production Camp. She was selected to be our Head Counselor (and "Camp Mom") in 2012 and has continued in this role since then. Last year, she additionally began serving as our Program Director.

This weekend, we honor Leah for all her contributions to On Stage and all the campers she has helped over the years. When asked why she continues to come back to On Stage, Leah states: "Camp changed my life, and I return year after year because I want to make sure that current and future campers have the same life-changing opportunities I experienced while a camper."



## **ABOUT THE PLAY**

This year is not the first foray into mythology for Summer Scholars Onstage. Nay, it has been done before, back in 1992. See, a few years prior to that, a visionary camper named Muse Davis had the idea to write a show about what the Greek Gods might be doing in modern times. (Aphrodite would be an aerobics instructor, Hercules a furniture mover, etc.) No one bought it. The idea was laughed out of the room. And it was so ridiculed that campers put it back on the wish list each year for the next several as a joke—a placeholder monument to a lame idea. Only it wasn't lame at all. In 1992, the "Greek Gods Idea," as it was known, returned to the brainstorming list, as per tradition, and did not get crossed out during elimination. It remained and became the show "It's Greek to Me." Our director, Kris Lee, played Apollo. It remains one of my favorite camp shows of all time.

Leap ahead 30 years. I'm doing my usual script coordinator brainstorming session with our 13 magical writers and they're already headed in mythological directions. They've, in fact, dreamed up their own myth set in neolithic times with archetypal deities, quests and the whole bit. But this was an idea for only one of the acts. Someone suggested doing a reality show parody starring mythological beings, and we began narrowing what directions that idea might take. *Hell's Kitchen* set in Dante's Inferno? We soon got stuck.

"We should think about the ideas we see on the list every year that we never use," one wise camper said. I laughed, then, and told them the story of the long journey of the Greek Gods Idea to the stage, noting that this year was the 30<sup>th</sup> anniversary of it.

"Huh," someone said in a tone of realization.

"Keeping up with the Olympians," someone else said. We all laughed and wrote it down. And when we began eliminating the ideas from consideration, it did not get crossed out.

The third idea, about a support group of America's folkloric monsters, came early Monday morning, inspired by a short play written by Anthony Kirkland, one of the campers. All three stories were voted on and approved with nary an argument and barely any discussion. The writing went swiftly after that, with all three acts basically at draft stage by Wednesday morning—a camp first for my experience. We remained ahead of our usual schedule for the rest of the week. We even had time to do a readthrough of the whole show on Friday, accompanied by live performances of the nine amazing original songs composed for the show by our talented songwriting track campers. It will be the first time this camp has used all original music in a show.

We tell the campers every year that they'll never have another experience quite like Summer Scholars Onstage. Well, this is my ninth time to serve as script coordinator and I've never had an experience quite like it either. It all came together smoothly and harmoniously. It was a pleasure to work with these talented writers, actors, and musicians. But a large part of me is simply thrilled that they've written a spiritual sequel to the Greek Gods Idea.
